



Secretary Report & Minutes of Meriden Amateur Radio Club (M.A.R.C.) July 2015

The business meeting opened at 7:33 PM EDST on July 9, 2015 with 21 people in attendance and one guest, a quorum was present.

Officers present: Bill (W1KKF), Al (N1API), Haggie (KB1HCC) and Steve (KC1AXJ).

The meeting was opened and chaired by President, Bill (W1KKF).

Announcements – The next meeting, an activity meeting, is July 23 which will be our picnic at Hubbard Park.

Introductions – All in attendance introduced themselves.

Secretary's Report – June's Secretary's Report was published on the W1NRG site. Correction, Rob (KC1ACN) is the Station Activities Manager.

Treasurer's Report - Reviewed at meeting and accepted.

Contributions - Not discussed

Correspondence – Mutual fund financial report and one new membership application from W1DQ.

Program & Entertainment – The club is still searching for a replacement for Rich (WA1TRY) for the Program & Entertainment chairman.

Scholarship –The recipient, Jeremy Santiago from Meriden, accepted the clubs Scholarship award this evening. Jeremy's Dad was present as well. Jeremy will be attending CCSU and majoring in Communication. Good luck Jeremy.

Club Station & Facilities – The cabinets need to be re-organized to gain easier/quicker access to equipment. Rob (KC1ACN) is getting cabinets to replace the worn cabinets we currently have. These cabinets are no cost to the club, thanks Rob.

Membership – Prior to new members this evening, total membership stands at 56. This consists of 53 paid members, 2 lifetime members and 1 complimentary membership. This evening we inducted two additional members to the club; John Elengo (W1DQ) is a new member to the club, and Jim Martin (WA1ZVY) was a member and has rejoined. Repeater - Not discussed

Instruction & Testing – Don (KE1AY) is still waiting for a few folks that wanted a testing session to get back to him. If interested in having a testing session, let Don know.

Candy Store – We still have hats for sale at \$10.

EmComm – The ARES EC for Wallingford is Mike Meadows (KC1AYL). September is the Wallingford YMCA road race which would be the next event.

Misc Old Business -

Operate W1AW – Paul (K1SEZ) is checking with Harold Kramer (WJ1B) at the ARRL on July 14th about having a Saturday session with our club in the fall.

Scholarship – At this point it was decided to keep the scholarship at the \$500 level and not increase it mainly due to the return on the investment being produced by the mutual fund. Don (KE1AY) will complete the changes to the current scholarship wording and send to Dave (K1WJL) for publication in Key Klix. It's planned that we will vote on this at the next business meeting.

<u>Antenna at clubhouse</u> – The build of the G5RV is the next step. John (N1GNV) is providing material for the antenna (thank you John!). Haggie (KB1HCC) and Bill (W1KKF) have a meeting with Ernie to show plans of antenna installation and wiring.

Misc. Old Business----cont.

New Rig – The committee came back with three suggestions based on the guidelines of a \$3k spend limit. The rig choices were; ICOM 7600 at \$2900, Yaesu FTDX3000, Kenwood TS-590SG. After a bit of discussion a vote was taken with the majority present voting to table the purchase of a new radio at this time. Tabling the purchase was centered on needing to have a permanent radio location (shack), having permanent antennas installed, and having a contesting agenda for the club. The club wants to thank the committee members who invested the time and effort researching technical specifications, pricing options and availability then presenting the choices to the club.

<u>Field Day results</u> – Bill (W1KKF) provided us with the results that we are submitting. Rob (KC1ACN) and Al (N1API), thanks for the help getting field day prep work done at the club house and organizing all the equipment.. In addition to 1050 points for emergency power, publication, message passing, capturing ARRL message, officials

present, info booth, etc. which added 1050 bonus points to the 2530 for a total of 3580 points for our 2F class. Last year we had 844 CW QSOs, 501 SSB QSOs and 1150 bonus points for a total of 5528 points. The solar flare that week didn't help the cause so band conditions weren't optimal this year but we all had fun!

New Business -

The Connecticut radio Society will be running Special Event this Sunday (July 11th). The call sign is K4U, look up K4U on QRZ for more details. This event commemorates the 75th anniversary of the Chance Vought F4U Corsair's 1st flight. Thanks Dave (W1CTN) for bringing this up. Steve (WV2LKM) has a crank up tower for the taking. This is a two section crank up tower where the longer section is about 19 feet long.

Steve did a talk on Morse Code and encouraged the kids to get into the hobby. They were a great bunch of kids and we all came away feeling it was a successful event for all.

John Blevins, K1VDF discovered the magic of radio while tuning across the shortwave band of his father's table radio in 1957. By 1961 he had earned his Novice class license and obtained the callsign KN1VDF. His original station consisted of a Globe Chief 75 watt CW transmitter, Hallicrafters S-120 receiver, and a dipole antenna. It wasn't long before he became president of the Milford Amateur Radio Club. From 1965 to 1967 John attended CT School of Electronics, and after graduating enlisted in the Army where they put him to work repairing microwave equipment. After serving in Germany and Viet Nam, he returned home and found employment with the phone company doing frame wiring, inside repair, cellular engineering, and 911 system integration.

John enjoys contests such as CQDX, ARRL DX, and Sweepstakes; has turned in scores of over two million points, worked over 200 band countries in 48 hours, and managed to earn DXCC in one weekend on one band. His current equipment consists of a Yaesu FT-990, Vibroplex paddle, AmpSupply LK550 amplifier using 3, 3-500's, KT34-A KLM antenna, and a HyGain HD 54' steel tower. Before this equipment he had a TA-33 tribander and tried a 10/15/20 Quad (upon advice of K1WJL) until an ice storm brought it all down. At one point he also had an18AVT HyGain vertical with 65 radials that he used to work 235 countries.

John is a previous President and Vice President of the MARC and has volunteered for every MARC FD for the past 35 years, and presides as the NCS for our club's weekly 10 meter net.

ROW, ROW, ROW YOUR BOAT

John Bee, N1GNV, came up with an interesting operating event that takes place on Saturday, August 29th. It is the US Islands QSO Party, sponsored by the US Islands Award Program. Nearly 3000 Islands have been listed by the 21 year old program, and a little more than 2000 of these have been activated. There are many more islands in the USA and its territories that qualify for listing since an Island only need be surrounded by water, at least 100 feet long and at least 50 feet from the main shoreline.

In the North Farms Reservoir there is an island that would meet this criteria. John proposes we bring a small rig, battery and an antenna to the island and put it on the air. This island has no name, as far as I can find, and it would be a new island on the list. The first reported activators of an island have their callsign (W1NRG) shown as the activator of this island on the USI list. Initial activation of an island requires at least 25 QSOs and contacts with at least 2 DX entities (usually the US and one other).






