


THE WB1GYZ FILES

Ed and Clare O'Lena N1YLN, KB1TMC were licensed 1996, 2013 respectively after having discovered SWL and CB radio during the '70s. Ed's uncle introduced him to his ham friends Dave W1BEM, and Ed K1JNH, who both became his Elmers. That meeting spurred Ed to get his amateur radio license. He bought the study guide "Now You're Talking" and was well on his way to becoming a ham. Clare was always a SWL aficionado, having received numerous QSL cards in return for mailing signal reports to foreign broadcast stations. Their mutual interest in radio sparked a lifelong shared hobby, where today Ed holds the Extra class license and Clare is a General. They operate a Ten-Tec Omni VI Plus transceiver and plan to install an all-band vertical antenna soon. They recently acquired a DMR with hot-spot to chat worldwide. Clare is also active with YLRL, Young Ladies Radio League, a world wide net that is almost as old as the ARRL.

Dave is employed as HVAC manager for a Waterbury company. Clare's work involves tariff management; she is responsible for soliciting NAFTA certificates for an American company with international sales.

When asked how they feel about the changing aspects of the hobby, Ed opined that the radio hobby has always been evolving, always technologically driven. "In order for the hobby to grow, it must change, especially if we want to bring in new members. With a nod to the past for keeping old boat anchors alive, we are also frontline communicators and must grow through innovation." Clare agrees, "We need innovation but must always be ready to resort to old ways when modern technology fails."

When asked for a memorable moment while operating, Ed recalled an incident that involved a private pilot whose plane experienced a complete loss of electrical power. His passenger, a ham radio operator, called for assistance on his handheld two meter rig, and Ed just happened to be listening to the national calling frequency of 146.520. The passenger and Ed exchanged pertinent information that was relayed to the Danbury airport control tower. The tower operator then activated runway lights and cleared the pilot for a night landing.

Ed and Clare are volunteer members of VFW auxiliary post 201, and also share another hobby...they are both avid train spotters, an avocation that has taken them to many scenic and historic geographical locations. Ed says he's a firm believer in kindling early interest for the hobby.

STATION ACTIVITIES MANAGER ROB CICHON K1RCT

Most of you that visit on Saturdays or attend meetings know that the FT-950 is in-operation at the North End HF Station. We have a "Nifty" guide for the FT-950 for those that want to learn how to use it. There also is a studio quality microphone attached. This station can connect to the T6 LP or the 80M Fan Dipole via the coax switch. Please remember these few things while operating:

The T6 LP Beam bands are 6M, 10M, 15M & 20M only.

The 80M Fan Dipole is 10M, 15M, 20M, 40M & 80M. It may also load-up on the WARC bands & 6M.

Be sure you have the Dunestar Band Pass Filter on the correct band prior to using any HF Rig. Be sure the 'Other HF Rig' is not on the same band as you are. The HF Rigs must NOT be on the same band.

Tuner: the internal tuner MUST be engaged. You may have to re-tune as you change frequency. It works similarly to the FT-991a machine. Press and hold the Tuner button until the servos engage the mechanism, then release. If SWR is within 3:1, the tuner will find the 'sweet-spot'. The -991a uses a different algorithm than the -950. You may need to re-tune the -991a repeatedly to find an acceptable SWR sweet-spot.

Be sure you allow the Auto Tuner to complete the tuning sequence prior to switching antennas and/or filters. Remember that when tuning, the rig is transmitting. I observed someone switching to another antenna while the Auto Tuner was engaged. Don't do this.

Telephone Pole @ North roof peak. After Lenny initially said, "Yes", Chief Heidgard Et Al thought that the Pole was a little too close to the building & the side hill and may cause problems with the Lawn Service people and gear. However he did approve the installation of a side mount at the peak. This mount will accommodate the 2M Beam, the 6M Beam and a 2M/70CM vertical all mounted on a rotator. This antenna system will be connected to the North End VHF/UHF Station (FT-991a) for VHF Contesting, VUCC and Rag Chewing when not engaged in its primary function of EMCOMM/AUXCOMM for WARG.

Weather Station at the OEM. At Lenny's request I recommended a Lacrosse Weather Station for the OEM. Only caveat was that the device should be purchased at Home Depot since Town purchases there do not require a PO. Lenny forwarded the recommendation to Chief Heidgard who approved & purchased it.

Hints & Kinks

CW FT-991a (South End HF Station) is connected to the Ten-Tec Tuner. If using the rig to run (call CQ), then use the external tuner. There is a tuning guide on the desk under or on the Tuner. If S&P (searching & pouncing) try to use the internal auto tuner while tuning around the dial. Be sure to use the pass-thru position on the external tuner Antenna Switch when using the rigs internal Auto Tuner.

Anyone know how to use a SDR IQ for panadaptor applications? We have such a device that I'd like to get set-up at the OEM. I thought I'd ask if anyone can assist in setting this up prior to having to research documents, find connecting cables and such first. High SWR (aka Reflections)

I joined the club as a nubee to the hobby in early 2014 and would classify myself as "unconsciously incompetent". At that time the club had about 55 members. I didn't know anything about Field Day, Sweepstakes, Contesting (Radiosport for those who like to feel fit). With the help of fellow members I did jump into the club and hobby with both feet and felt very welcome.

In late 2014 K1SEZ decided he wasn't going to run for club secretary in 2015 and suggested that I run for office, he thought I'd do a good job. I won the election (no one else wanted the office..... that should have been a heads up to me). I stumbled a lot in 2015 since I've never held any office. W1KKF was newly elected into the Presidents chair, but had previous years of experience in that office, and so he offered up guidance each month that I wrote up the meeting minutes.

By the end of 2015 I was feeling consciously incompetent. I had two Field Days, Sweepstakes and one U.S. Islands event under my belt and was feeling more comfortable with the club and the hobby. I decided to teach myself new things in 2016. I decided to learn SQL database management and created a database of the MARC membership that tracks many facets of each member allowing for detailed reports to be run without much effort. The database development project took the better part of 2016 to develop and happy to say it's being passed on to future club secretaries.

2017 was a pivotal year for the club. Wallingford allowed us to move from the Cook Hill facility in late 2016 to the current OEM building we utilize today. Slow going with a lot of volunteer help from the club moving our stuff to the new building. We also finally got a permanent radio room thanks to K1RCT, K1VDF, K1LYP, KB1JL, WB1GYZ, WA1VXH(sk) and a few others. We made it through some of the growing pains of the emergency management portion of MARC (called WARG), but that group has successfully worked with Wallingford most notably during the tornado's this past spring.

In late 2017 I shifted gears a little since my job required some travel out of the area, a little more than was useful to the club. By early 2018 I realized I couldn't keep up the pace and relinquished my office of Secretary of Nutfest (now N1OKR). The constitution committee was formed in 2018, which I was the chairperson. The committee met and spent many hours editing the version of the constitution which was last freshend in 2009. After 5 months of work and a few compromises, the new constitution was ratified by the membership and is now in place.

Mid-2018 I contacted WIKKF and informed Bill that I was not seeking re-election as Secretary of MARC. Work had become to unpredictable for me to commit to be at every business meeting. NZ1J stepped up and put his name on the ballot, and now Dave will carry on as Secretary in 2019. I wish all 2019 officers the best of luck in the future and look to support club operation.

I will continue to be a contributor to the success of the club and look forward to working with the entire MARC membership.

He installed a new Mosley 7 element Pro-57-B beam on his 70' tower, ran new buryflex coax, and is unwrapping a brand new TS890 Kenwood rig and a 160-6 meter 1.5 KW Acom A-1500 amplifier. Paul, KE1LI and Ed, K1ZE assisted Bob with the antenna installation.

The new hardware replaced a Wilson System One installed in 1979 by noted tower men in their day, K1WJL and K1VDF.(Editors note..we also installed the tower, a 70', Rohn Fold-over and a 25 pound bag full of tools slipped out of my hand at about 60 ft. and missed K1VDF by at about two feet.) The System One withstood the New England weather for almost 40 years, until a 20 meter trap failed this summer.
