Stephen Bruce Tripp (K1iiG) of Wallingford passed on June 22, 2021 after a 9-month battle with glioblastoma brain cancer. He was born in Hartford, CT on January 12, 1944 to Rollin and Catherine (Patterson) Tripp.

He grew up in Hartford, Bloomfield and Jewett City, CT. He was proud of his British roots and of being Griswold High Class of '62 Best Dancer. A self-proclaimed geek, he studied electronics at Hartford State Technical College. Steve's passion was Ham Radio. He proudly earned his Amateur Radio Operator's License at age 14. His expertise landed him a life-long

job at SNET (now AT&T) where he claimed bragging rights to "making the first cell phone call in CT." Steve leaves behind his wife, Marsha (Badenhop-Tinella) Tripp; grandsons, Devon and Dylan Tripp of Jewett City, CT; sisters Claudia (Bob) Stratton of Murietta, CA and Kathy Schweickert of Venice FL; two nephews and loving caregiver, Deb Negralle. Secretary's Report (N1BRL) May meeting minutes were approved by majority vote.

N1BRL presented 1 application for new membership. W1TK Ron Wakefield was approved by a show of hands on Zoom without objection. Membership is now 111. No correspondence to report.

Treasurer's Report (K1WJL) was read by Dave. Details are available from Dave upon request. The annual audit will be done by N1ZN, K1LHO and K1WJL in the next week.

Station Manager's Report (K1RCT) some of the items in the SAM Report were: weather station Wi-Fi disconnect, repair of the 2 meter 70 centimeter CERT antenna, repair of the Buddy Pole Antenna System, results of the first club flea market, and registration of the club call sign with POTA and SOTA so members can submit activations.

Standing Committees and working groups

Entertainment/Activities, – There was a discussion of Field Day planning in 2 weeks and Lark in the Park next month.

Technical, No interference reported.

Scholarship, N1ZN, K1LHO, KC1ISI and K1RCT will review the three scholarship applications this year.

Publicity, – No report.

Repeater, – Repeater committee meeting is scheduled for 12 June.

Other Activities, NZ1J reports there is continued interest and support for the unsanctioned fox hunts with a few new hunters. Both NZ1J and KC1NQE are active in Parks On The Air (POTA) and Summits On The Air (SOTA) with many club members supporting their activations. There were no contest activations to report. The club nets all continue with AB1DQ requesting volunteers to be Net Control Ops for the TechNet Net along with topic suggestions. N1API reminded us the Castle Craig Chapter of Ten Ten International will have its Summer QSO Party on 7-8 August with details to follow.

Website, The website is maintained and updated regularly with current information. Moving it to a new platform is a long range project for now.

Instruction VE /Training, KE1AY reports there is one candidate scheduled for the coming VE session on 12 June.

WARG/EMCOM/Aux Com, We continue to be limited in the number of members that are permitted inside the EOC on weekends but there are suggestions that we may be able to return to closer to normal operations soon.

Old Business, One of the 3 membership certificate templates is complete and the other 2 are near completion. They should soon be available on the website for downloading and printing by members.

New Business, The town of Wallingford was pleased with our "CQ Santa" program last year and has requested we conduct it again this year. This year's "Lark in the Park" will be at Marcus Cook Park on 22 July. K1LYP will coordinate. Various options to honor Bill, W1KKF were offered for consideration at a later date. W1YSM announced he plans for business meetings to be of a hybrid format utilizing in person and Zoom formats once we are able to resume in person meetings at the EOC. N1GNV reminded the membership that next year will be the 75th club anniversary.

AN INTERESTING ARTICLE PICKED OFF THE EMAILS FROM RICH WA1TRY

Don't dismiss lead acid batteries. Properly maintained, they are a good bang for the buck. Where we live on a dirt road up on a small mountain top, the power lines are often knocked out as tree branches grow and touch the power lines. Usually this causes a sort outage of 1 to 6 hours before they can get on site to cut away the limbs and reset the power. I got tired of dragging the a generator out of the garage, gassing it up and hooking it up for short times. My solution was a pair of commercial Golf Cart batteries and a pure sine wave 1500 watt continuous duty (3000 surge) inverter.

The batteries are large and weight about 80 lbs each. They are occasionally sold new locally for about 90 bucks each. They provide about 215 Amp Hours of power and run all the essentials in my house for about 6 to 8 hours. Any longer than that and I switch over to the generator.

Been using this system now for 2 years and have had about 6 outages. Never needed the generator.

The emergency backup power break out box is zoned so I can turn on or off the power to any of the 4 zones controlling lights and plugs in the living room, Kitchen (refrigerator) dining room, furnace room (and the furnace in the basement where the batteries are stored, all the house electronics (modem, routers, computers, etc) various lights and plugs, the garage and of course the ham shack. Longest outage I've run on only batteries was about 6 hours last Winter. Was nice to only have to walk downstairs to the basement and turn on the inverter and move a few switches on Aux power panel. Sure beat trudging out in the snow storm and putzing with the generator. Batteries are not the biggest .. only 215 amp hours. Plan to pick another pair before next winter. Got 'em on sale new at Batteries Plus Bulbs in Manchester .. 90

bucks each when on sale. Outlet to the left is where either the basement Inverter or the external feed from the outside generator is plugged in. The four zones have 3 - position switches for Gen/Invert. - Off - Line. The Inverter was originally around \$300 but I found a solar panel outfit that was closing them out at 120 bucks.

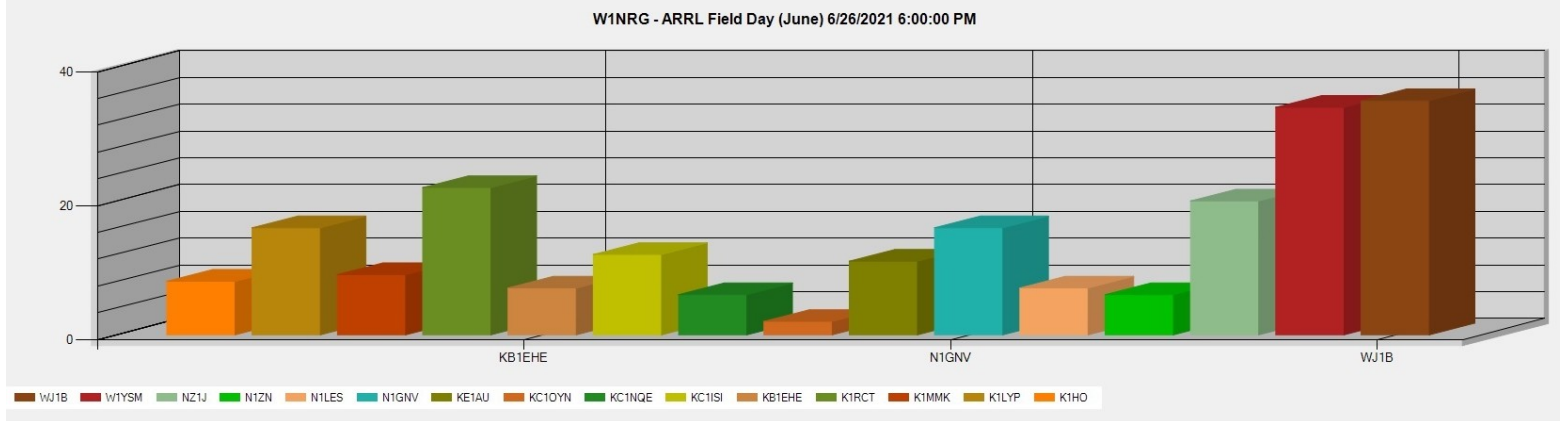

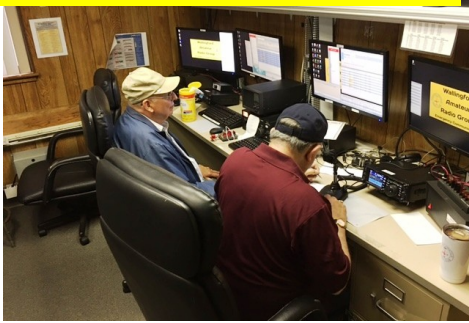

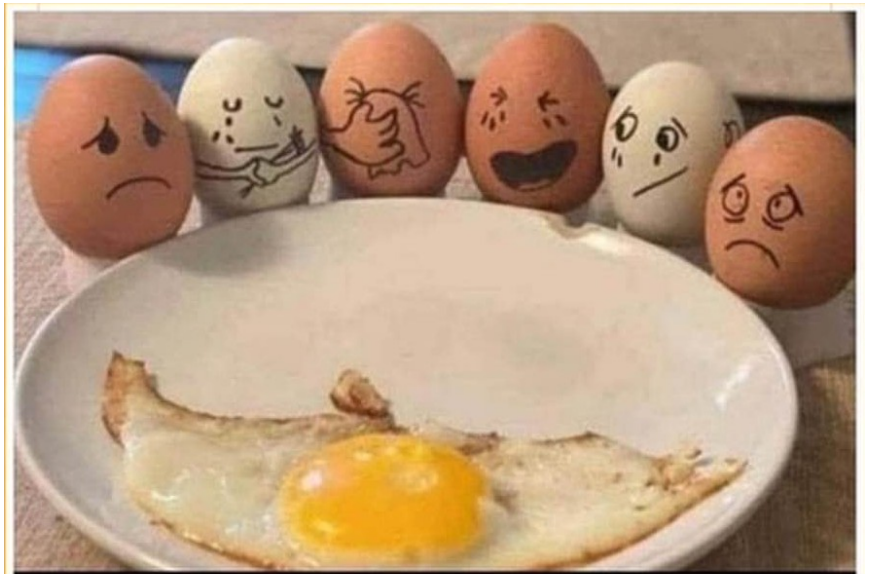

Castle Craig Chapter, 10/10 News

There will be a Castle Craig Chapter Net on Friday August 6th 2021 on the club net frequency of 28.375. The purpose of this net is to kick off the 10-10 Winter QSO Party. I hope that all club members will join in. Even if you do not have a 10-10 number you are worth 1 point to the rest of us who do and are submitting logs. The QSO party runs from 0000 UTC August 7th 2021 to 2359:59 August 8th 2021. If you are a paid up 10-10 member your support of the club, and our chapter would be appreciated. Please make as many contacts as you can, and submit your log for credit. Remember to mention that you would like to credit Castle Craig Chapter of 10-10 with your score.

Log submission must be made by 8/13/21 by email to tentencontest@ten-ten.org You can also mail your log to the contest coordinator Dan Morris KZ3T, 3162 Covington Way, Lenoir, NC 28645.

We will start taking checkins at 7:45 PM local time, (23:45UTC), and I will be the Net Control. I would like a station to help with relays if needed. The procedure is simple. At 8 PM local time, (0000 UTC Aug. 7th), we will start from the top of the list, (myself), and I will give my 10-10 information, that is Call, Name, QTH (state), and 10-10 number. The next station will be called and that person will give their information and then stand by. We will proceed to the bottom of the list. The procedure is then repeated from the top to bottom of the list, except you will call all stations that you heard and QSL their information. If you need a repeat on any information this is the time to ask for it. Once the last station is called they should have no calls to make because everyone has called them.

I expect that this net should last no more than about 20 minutes. Also, as you talk to local, (Connecticut), stations on 10 meters and also on the different bands please mention this QSO party and ask them to check 10 meters at times during the weekend to participate. Please remind them that if they are in the local ground wave area and members of 10-10, that The Castle Craig Chapter of 10-10 is their local chapter and we would appreciate their support for the QSO Parties. We've seen a few non MARC club members submitting their score for the chapter. We'd like to see more. Castle Craig usually finishes pretty well in the chapter standings. We'd like to do better.

If you have your collected 10-10 numbers sitting now is the time to send them in or go to the 10-10 web page at <http://www.ten-ten.org/memship.html> and either use the online shopping cart to join or fill out a paper application and mail it in. There is a special three year incentive plan for \$40.00 or you can join for the basic \$15.00 a year. 10-10 has a membership plan with electronic delivery of the 10-10 News and there are special rates for new and rejoining members of \$10.00 for one year and a three year incentive for \$25.00. It takes about three weeks to get your number back via mail but if you apply online your new number will come via email in just a few days. Remember you need to be a paid up member for your log to count for awards and also toward the club score. A good incentive for joining is that ALL 10-10 awards are FREE, and most if all do not require QSL cards and can be applied for via email. You will receive award certificates by return mail, (or), for many, you can ask for a PDF certificate to put in your computer or post on your web pages. For those members who are an OM/YL team there is A family membership rate. It is a good way for both to join and get in on the fun.

Even if you've decided that you are not interested in becoming a 10-10 member, you can still get on and give contacts out to those who are working the QSO Party. Your point will be welcomed. The 10-10 Officers and volunteers realize that 10 meters is staring to come of of it's minimum sunspot cycle but they still encourage everyone to work the QSO parties, check 10 meters out and make as many contacts as they can. 10-10 was formed to keep 10 meter band active so that it is not lost to other services and that idea is still paramount in the organization's concepts.

Also, you can submit a log as a checklog if you are not a paid up 10-10 member, (though I stress this would be good time to take advantage of the 3 year incentive offer). And if you still decide that 10-10 is not your cup of tea but do get on and pass your information to others, you can also submit a log as a check log. The purpose of 10-10 is to keep the band active and your log is a good way to demonstrate band activity.

Please plan to attend and get the Summer 10-10 QSO party off to a rousing start!
