The rest came naturally due to the membership facing - as did everyone else - isolation and a need for human contact. This is where the Club and amateur radio came to the rescue. We can thank Dave NZ1J and Rob K1RCT for our weekly fox hunts. They have kept us together as friends and as a Club. Indeed, our Club membership has grown from the 80's to the 110's – an impressive increase of ~ 30%. Plus, we have become quite proficient at triangulating. Now after over 60-70 fox hunts, as they say. “What else ya’ got?”

Fortunately – we – the hobby and the Club, have ‘gotta lot’. As the pandemic ends, from what I am hearing, W1NRG may be meeting in-person, indoors at the OEM, in about a month or two. Since the weather is, so far so good, are there other outdoors activities that MARC can focus on? Well, along comes “OTA” activities. ## Secretary Report & Minutes of the Meriden Amateur Radio Club

**MAY 13 , 2021 BUSINESS MEETING**

Business meeting May 13, 2021 via Zoom videoconference

Meeting was called to order by President W1YSM at 1930 local

Normal introductions were omitted as all attendees (31) are self-identified in 'Zoom' ,K1RCT, N1API, N1BRL, W1DQ, W1EDX, K1JCF, N1LES, KC1DOY, WV2LKM, KB1JL, K1STM, KC2MLH, KE1AU, KC1PBQ, K1MTD, KB1EHE, W1YSM, K1WJL, KC1KQH, NZ1J, KC1OYN, N1FNE, K1VDF, KC1OYM, N1ZN, WB1GYZ, WA1ZVY, W3APC, N1GNV, K1LYP, K1LHO.

**Announcements** (W1YSM), OEM access is still limited to a max of 10 people with mask, Gordon West, "Real Hams and Real Emergencies" will be the guest speaker at the May 27activities meeting, combination Zoom and in person hybrid business meetings are being considered for the future.

**Secretary's Report** (N1BRL) March and April meeting minutes were approved by majority vote.

N1BRL presented 4 applications for new membership, KC1PBQ Randy Rivest, K1MTD Mary Duval, K1RMA Don Richards, KC1PHK Lincoln Nichols, who were each approved by a show of hands on Zoom and there were no objections. 1 applicant N1FNE Rod Lane was approved by a show of hands on Zoom with a single light hearted opposition by a personal friend. Email correspondence from W1FYG Don Izzo was received expressing his condolences to the club regarding SK W1KKF Bill Wawrzeziak.

**Treasurer's Report** (K1WJL) was read by Dave. Details are available from Dave upon request.

**Station Manager's Report** (K1RCT) some of the items in the SAM Report were: EOC activity and radio room disinfection, G5RV antenna is down so reassignment of antennas in the radio room, RF check out, reduction in radio repair bench footprint and Buddy Pole system availability for SOTA & POTA activations.

The SAM report is available upon request.

**OEM/EOC opening** Building usage continues to be restricted to 10 people with masking and continued COVID prevention protocols as per the town.

**Standing Committees and working groups**

Entertainment/Activities, – Gordon West will be the guest speaker at the May activities meeting on Zoom.

Technical, The new updated FCC RF Exposure Rules Notice and its' application to all amateurs were discussed.

The club station has already been surveyed by the Station Activities Manager and found to comply so long as transmission power is less than 800 W.

Scholarship, Jim N1ZN has contacted the 3 Meriden High Schools to inform them of the scholarship availability.

Publicity, – No report.

Repeater, – N1LES was added to the repeater committee.

**Other Activities.** There is growing club interest in activations such as Parks On The Air and Summits On The Air. NZ1J has done a few and members are reminded of the availability of the Buddy Pole and other equipment for various OTA's. Fox hunts continue to draw a number of members and even an out of state ham. Website updates continue. Plans for 13 Colonies Special Event are in the works with several members ready to operate as K2D. All of the club nets continue to be well attended. Todd K1TDO has returned as NSC on 2 meters and AI N1API continues to fill-in for the recovering John K1VDF on 10 meters. Lark in the Park is set for 22 July with details to follow.

Instruction VE /Training N1ZN reported about the recent VE session: there were 2 new Technicians(one was 12 years old), 2 upgrades to General and one upgrade to Extra class. The next VE session will be 12 June at the OEM. Updated New Ham Kits were provided to the examinees.

June 5<sup>th</sup> Flea Market at the EOC 8 - 10 AM is being planned for club members, anyone may attend but only club members may sell.

Certificate of Membership and business cards, 3 certificate of membership forms are being finalized and will become available online.

Nutfest – The full featured Nutfest will be delayed until 2022. A scaled down alternative such as "Not fest" or "Yankee Peddler Ham fest" is being considered.

WARG/EMCOM/Aux Com, Retiring Fire Chief Heidgerd was presented with a MARC Certificate and a Challenge Coin. Ed W1YSM initiated contact with the new Acting Fire Chief Joseph Czentnar.

Candy Store Gold Medal Ideas has updated the line of MARC wares.

**Old Business** no discussion needed.

New Business. Scanning and storage of archival documents on the club website was discussed. A CW training net was proposed based on a Zoom format. Field Day plans will be finalized at a later date. A motion to have the repeater PL on input configured on an "As Needed Basis" was defeated.

March and April minutes were approved.

Repeater PL use on an 'As needed basis' was defeated. 4 votes in favor, 9 votes opposed and 4 abstained.



All contacts were on 40M at 7.232 MHz, running 100 watts from my mobile installed FT891 to either a Buddistick or my lip mounted ATAS-120 on the rear hatch of my MINI.

5 contacts were with Ontario stations, 4 were with NY operators, 2 with ME and PA stations, and 1 each with hams in DE, MD, NJ, OH and TN. It was an absolutely gorgeous morning atop the mountain (well, the peak is less 1000 feet ASL, but who am I to judge?). Mega thanks to KC1NQE, NZ1J and WB8IMY for showing me the way!

## PARKS ON THE AIR



Friday, May 28, 2021 saw two (Count 'em, two!) activations of Parks On The Air for M.A.R.C. Dave, NZ1J, started in Wharton Brook State Park at 8AM planning to work until 11 but was cut short when his battery gave out early. Even so, he made 19 contacts, two of them out of state (Puerto Rico and Nebraska). Dave worked out of the back of his car with a very convenient arrangement of gear.

Here is his setup in his own words. "I essentially brought my home station to the park. I didn't buy anything. I used my Icom 7300 and MFJ tuner along with the lawn tractor battery I've been using for Fox Hunting. I supported a wire dipole with a fiberglass rod from a dome tent. My setup is sure to evolve from here."

Shawn, KC1NQE, had better luck operating from the Naugatuck State Forest beside the Quunipiac Trail in Cheshire. He made 39 contacts total, 6 park to park, 2 of which were in CT, NZ1J in Wharton Brook and NR1B in Dinosaur State Park. In his own words, "My shining gold star goes to MM5DWW in Scotland with a signal of 3/5. Contacts were made in FL, IA, OH, AL, VA, PA, NY, and Canada. I have had my Ham license less than a year, and only had HF access for about a month. My first POTA activation last week on Lamentation Mountain was my very first time calling CQ, Naugatuck SF was my second. POTA has been a great way, as a new ham, to pick up the mic."
