Yale University Radio Club had MARC Ties......

Meriden Amateur Radio Club members James Surprenant, AB1DQ and Ed Snyder, W1YSM were recently elected as officers of W1YU, the Amateur Radio Club at Yale University. James was elected to the office of First Vice President and will be responsible for managing relations with the ARRL and other amateur radio organizations and clubs and will also be responsible for overseeing education, training and other programmatic activities. Ed was elected to the Secretary/Treasurer position. As Secretary, he will keep all club meetings and member records and administer changes to the club constitution. As Treasurer, Ed will receive and receipt all monies paid to the club, keep accurate accounts, pay bills with proper authorization and report on the clubs financial status twice a year.

James is employed as a grant accountant and Ed is a professor of Laboratory Medicine at the Yale School of Medicine and the Director of Apheresis/Transfusion Services at Yale New Haven Hospital. W1YU has been dormant in recent years and Ed and James are hoping to provide leadership in reviving the club as a vibrant and active student organization. Membership in W1YU is open to all Yale students, alum, and all faculty or administrators, active or retired.

VE Status via AI N1API

This past week I discovered that my VE Badge did not have an updated sticker on it. I emailed the VE questioning if the badge stays concurrent with your license. I received an email back telling me that I've done 25 sessions and my last one was in 2000. Because I had not been active as a VE my badge was not automatically renewed in 2014. The VEC wants you remain active. Each "grant" on your badge is good for 5 years, and they expect you to do sessions during that term. They did not specify how many but stated, "It is expected that VE's will continue to be active in administering the exams, maintaining their knowledge and skills in the ARRL Volunteer Examiner program."

My accreditation was placed on "administrative hold" which they explained, "This is not termination, nor a suspension. It just wasn't automatically renewed in 2014". In order to re-accredit my certification as a VE I was required to resubmit the one page application found on Page 19 of the VE manual. Also I needed to complete the 40 question open book test *again* on pages 20 through 22 of the manual. Finally, they needed a copy of my current license. The latest edition of the manual can be found at: http://www.arrl.org/ve-manual

The instructions in their email were: "Review the Table of Contents and Front pages, especially Chapter 2 of the VE Manual. Then once you've read the manual and have completed the required application document or documents, please fax or mail/courier the requested forms to:ARRL / VEC225 Main Street Newington CT 06111-1494 or Fax to: 860-594-0339 Faxing allows a "quicker head-start" in the processing. If the application is faxed, we will still need to have the one page application form mailed in to us. (See http://www.arrl.org/arrlvec/become-a-ve.html"I would suggest that if you are a VE you check your badge for a current dated sticker. If has expired email the VEC at vec@arrl.org and inquire if you can get a renewed sticker. I don't know how long they would honor an out of date badge without having to re-certify but I'm guessing 2 years is too long. If it has just expired you may be given a renewed sticker. I would advise you to then get to a session ASAP!

Myself I've been at the club table for the Nutmeg Hamfests and that's my excuse for not doing a session in so long. It looks like I need to get someone to watch the table for a couple of hours and get to a session at least every couple of years, more if necessary. We should probably cycle our VEs through sessions so that they stay certified, possibly going in and grading a couple of exams or assist handing out or collecting exams. The manual says that even if the VEs don't actually grade exams or sign CSCEs they are listed as volunteers if they participate. (Knowledge by osmosis?)

I'd also like to suggest that the club do a VE session in April or May at the meeting location. This would give us 2 sessions a year and if published early enough we could get candidates from out of our local membership area who need a test session. It would also give more VEs a chance to participate. Had I known that I needed a few session under my belt to be renewed I would have jumped in more often rather than wait until my sticker expired and I found out I needed to go through the whole process again.

This year for the first time I believe since I joined 10-10 after getting my license in 1979 I will not be able to participate in the Summer 10-10 QSO Party. I will be traveling back from Germantown, TN (Memphis), after attending the MARAC convention, who knows I may be the one who finds Elvis. The dates for the party are August 6th and 7th. It runs the full 24 hours and there are no mandatory rest periods. More information and rules are at: http://www.ten-ten.org/index.php/activity/2013-07-22-20-26-48/qso-party-schedule Despite not being able to participate, I'd still like to see the chapter make a good showing in the QSO party. I believe I have someone willing to run the kick-off net on Friday. Actually it can be run anytime during the weekend if enough like.

I hope everyone will get on and make a many QSOs as possible. 10 meters can surprise you. I've done Winter QSO Parties and made 50 contacts and expecting to do poorly in the summer event made 250 or more QSOs because the short skip, or "E" skip opened up or even double hop to the west coast. Never count 10 out! With me not working the QSO Party W1NRG with it's 29650 is available to give out. If the club wanted to try an effort from wherever we are located that could be done. Or if someone wanted to try from home that works too. It does not have to be a 10-10 member either. The rules were changed that a non-member could operate a club station in the party. You would need to do a couple of things. First you need to let the Trustee, WA1VXH know that you will be using W1NRG that weekend.

Also you will need to log your contacts. Logging is simple Date and UTC time, Name, State or DX Country, and 10-10 number if the station has one otherwise it's zero for the number. You can log to paper, or a program if you have one, N1MM has a 10-10 module I've never used it so I am unfamiliar with it. You can also log to Win1010 on the club's laptop. You will need to make arrangements with the SAM KC1ACN to get the laptop if you need it. I can show you how to open the contest and log. It is very simple, I'll set it all up before hand. All you will need to do is turn on the computer open the program and select the contest. If it is a known call, (say you put in N1API), or 25468 in the call sign field, the fields populate with all the information, you do need to verify it in QSO and enter. It will log it and score two or one points depending on if the station has a number or not. For unknown calls you will need to fill the name state and number in if they have one. You do have some help as the Callbook information shows in a window for a known call but you should always hear the information in cause the first name is different, IE Rick instead of Richard or he is portable someplace away from home. After the contest I would need the paper log, ADIF from N1MM or your logging program or the club computer to get the log off.

Anyone interested in doing W1NRG # 29650 please let me know so we can figure out how you want to log and any information you need to work the QSO Party.

I hope to see some "impressive" scores when I get back, (and a chance for some to take 1st Place in the 1st Call area away from me and possibly get in the Top 10 in the News).


