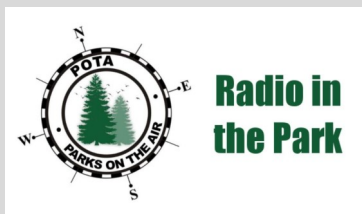

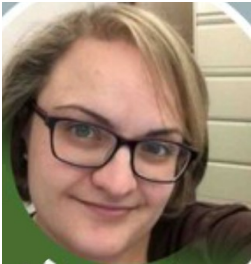

GROWING — GROWING — GROWING

Much like the catchphrase from the kitchen renovation commercial, MARC membership is 'growing growing, growing'. One of our members, John K1LYP, told me a year or two ago that having too many members in the club is a good thing. Up to a point I agree with him. Currently, however, we will have approximately 166 members in the club as of this Thursday's Business Meeting, when we will enroll 4 new members. James, AB1DQ is finishing up the technician FCC license class with 20 students. Of those, we can probably expect 10 to 11 to get their license and join MARC. If so, that will give us close to 175 members, and from there, it's only a hop, skip, and a jump to 200 members.

One concern I have is whether MARC is ready to have 200 members. I am not sure what the largest number of members has been in the club's history, but I do know that when I joined, we had about 78 members. It's like the little snowball that starts off at the top of a steep hill. It starts as a tiny aggregate of a couple of snowflakes, and as it rolls downhill it accumulates more and more snow so that by the time it gets near the bottom of the hill it is a gigantic snowball rushing headlong into whatever is at the bottom of the mountain. Why has the club grown so big? It is probably due to several factors. First, is the welcoming approach that we have when new recruits come to visit us at the OEM on Saturday mornings. The second largely is due the efforts of two people who have been tireless in supporting our monthly VE sessions – Don KE1AY (SK) and Jim N1ZN, along with our many members who have assisted them over the last several years. We also have multiple OnAir Nets, CW classes (Bob WB1GYZ) and large programs supporting POTA (Shawn KC1NQE) and Fox Hunts (Dave NZ1J). When coupled with word of mouth via Facebook and social media, and our aforementioned general welcoming attitude towards new hams, a club size of 200 members appears reasonable.

Personally, however, I don't think that MARC can sustain a membership of 200 or more, without making some substantive changes in the way we do things. Maybe I am wrong, but we need to have more communication among the membership to help integrate new members into the club. We need to support member hams upgrading their licenses. Perhaps we need more activities on Saturday mornings and we need to be more proactive in getting people on the air. Maybe antenna building sessions would be popular, or classes on digital modes, etc. Many senior and experienced club members are retired, and they relish their free time – as well they should. I am not looking to saddle them (not that I could anyway) with a whole variety of activities that they would be responsible for leading. The problem is how to have more activities and not over-burden our members. We have a lot of activities and people can pick and choose among them. Some people, however, just join a club and don't really want to participate but just like to be a part a large amateur radio club. That's ok, too.

MARC's public image is growing. We are well recognized in Newington by the ARRL for our MARCONI Project, our Balloon launches, our Nutmeg Hamfest and our VE sessions, to name a few. Also, we are involved in other events, the Big E, and scouting activities. One of the plans I have for this coming year, if re-elected as MARC President, would be to have a series of Town Hall meetings to ask and see what the club members wish to do. As a club, we are doing a lot and I am not planning to propose a large number of new activities. There are some things that we will need to consider, but in general, I think the club can sit back a bit and do what it enjoys doing most -- being amateur radio operators. How things will shake out I don't know, but I am committed to ensuring that as we pass 200 in the coming months with our eyes set on the possibility of 300 members, we have to change the way we do business and increase our communication with new as well as existing club members, and promote the varied activities that we offer. So, stay tuned. I look forward to working with all of you, as we try in 2024, to keep the Meriden Amateur Radio Club, vital, active, relevant, and involved. Above all, however, I am in favor of promoting fun and the "joie de radio", for all of our members.

In order to submit a log for Meriden ARC in the ARRL contests, you must be listed under W1NRG's group of operators who have expressed a desire to contest for the Club.

I have volunteered to maintain the list of operators and submit them to the ARRL.

MARC enters in the Local Class, of operators within a 35 mile limit of the club. In this class we compete with other local club and small contest groups. There is no limit to the number of members we can list, in fact the contester does not need to be a club member. As long as he is in the 35 mile limit of W1NRG and wants a club to give his score to, he (or she), can join the list of operators. You can submit for any of the ARRL Contests, SSB, CW or Digital where the rules allow Club Competition. For Post Office Box addresses you need to list your physical station location.

If you would like to join this distinguished group of operators the procedure is simple, just sent me an email with your call and your 6 digit locator grid. You can also leave me a private message in the W1NRG Forum. If you do not know your 6 digit grid or your listed address is a PO Box, (we are all in FN31), I can find it from your street address. It is also listed in your QRZ information under the "Details" tab.

We've had a number of new members join who have an interest in contesting and a few who've improved their antenna systems. Even if you only make 20 or 25 QSOs from your home QTH, every point helps us when the scores are tallied to compete against the other local clubs. You can also list as a local member even if you belong to a larger contesting group for those contests the bigger groups don't participate in like the State and Local QSO Parties and contests.

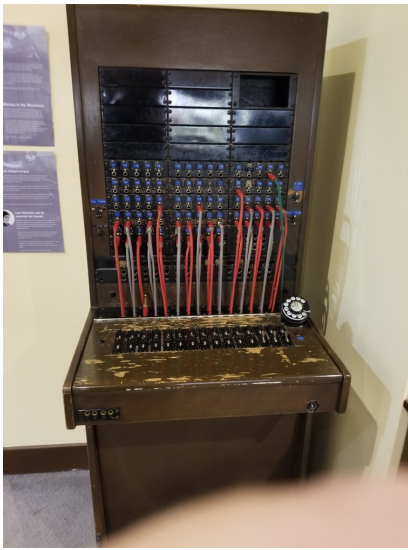
