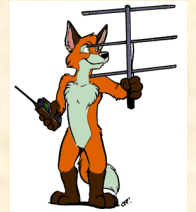

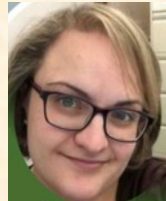

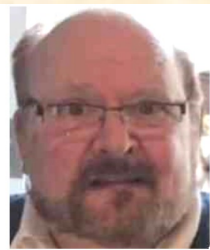

IN MEMORIAM BOB TRUSSELL KA1JKV



Robert "Bob" Trussell, 83, of [Plantsville, CT](#), passed away on March 15, 2024 surrounded by his family. He was born on January 17, 1941, in [Easton, MD](#). Bob was a dedicated individual who had a successful career. He worked at the Upjohn Company in the Process Development and Quality Assurance Laboratory for many years before transitioning to sales at Axton Cross and Turf Products Corporation. He later retired from The Cheshire Herald in 2005. Bob was deeply involved in his community and had various interests. He was an active member of the

Republican Town Committee, serving as Treasurer and 4th District Coordinator. He was also a member of Temple Lodge 16, where he served as Master in 2001. Additionally, he was a member of the Scottish Rite, Valley of New Haven, and Lafayette Consistory. Bob was known for his volunteer work at the Cheshire Senior Center and his passion for stamp collecting. He was a member of The American Philatelic Society, The American Revenue Association, The American Radio Relay League with the amateur radio call sign KA1KJV, the Silver City Gun Club, Connecticut Citizens Defense League, and The National Rifle Association.

Bob is survived by his wife, Catherine of 35 years; children Robert Trussell Jr. and Janet, Lisa Hague and husband Richard, Michele Dubay and husband Richard; grandchildren Jason Hague, Alyssa Hague, Gabriella Radin, Eli Radin; great-grandchildren Charles and Lily Hague. He was preceded in death by his son Jamie, his father Rev. Frederick C. Trussell, and his mother Marion W. Trussell (Wilson). A memorial service was held on Saturday, March 23, 2024, at Holy Saviour Parish at the National Catholic Church in Naugatuck. Bob's legacy of hard work, community involvement, and diverse interests will be remembered by all who knew him.

NET CONTROL – IT'S EASIER THAN IT LOOKS

When I was just starting out in amateur radio, I was attending a SKYWARN weather net during a snowstorm. I had initially signed-in to several previous SKYWARN Nets to just listen and after a while, took the plunge, pushed the PTT button and checked-in. To my surprise the earth did not tremble when I checked-in for the first time and threw out my call saying "W1YSM". The Sun did not suddenly reverse direction and rise in the west and set in the east. Most surprisingly, when I counted, I had not lost any vital body parts. I actually enjoyed being part of the Net experience. Anyway, on that fateful day there I was happily waiting for the SKYWARN storm Net to start. After 5-7 minutes of silence, however, it became clear that the scheduled Net Control Operator was not coming. Douglas WA1SFH – [smiling friendly ham] our ARES 2 Coordinator said suddenly, "Well, the Net Control is not coming, Ed W1YSM take over please!". Note that at the end of that sentence was an exclamation point, not a question mark. WA1SFH told me to take over - no choice involved – zero degrees of freedom. So, I did, and that started my career as a Net Control Station (NCS) Operator.

I overcame my mic-fright in about 30 seconds. At the time I was too nervous to be mad or refuse. The Net went fine since I had LISTENED TO SEVERAL PREVIOUS NETS AND KNEW THE DRILL. That is the key to learning to be a NCS Operator and running a Net – LISTENING. Being NCS is not rocket science or brain surgery – all it needs is slice of common sense, with a generous helping of respect for people and an ability to communicate in a friendly but focused manner. There are multiple books and video clips and articles on how to become an NCS. These are fine for learning the etiquette and learning how to manage and establish order during what can be a pile-up. But unless you listen in to the Net of your choice while it is On Air, you will not really figure out how to manage the control part of the NCS experience. Listen first, then speak. Sometimes you need to listen a lot. Some folks are so terrorized at the thought of managing and talking with 10-15 check-ins, that they will not be able to properly run a Net. Public speaking is not for everyone. Similarly, those who cannot control their own desire to hear (only) their voice, might not be a good NCS operator either. Like Goldilocks and the three bears, the middle porridge is the one to go with (not too hot [loquacious] and not too cold [taciturn] . Sorry to have mangled that metaphor.

Each type of Net has different characteristics. A Rag Chew Net is different from a Traffic Net and they are different from a SKYWARN Net, etc. FEMA has standards for handling Emergency and Disaster Nets that pass traffic and require strict adherence to Incident Command protocols. MARC has multiple nets — mostly of the rag chew variety-- on 2m, 6m and 10m. I run a SKYWARN Net at 1900 on Tuesdays as well as the MARC W1NRG Coffee Cup Net Saturdays from 0900-1000 ET on the Club repeater 147.36 PL 162.2 and a +600 KHz offset. The Nets we run are listed in Key Klix as well as being listed on our Club web site. Some Nets have 5-8 check-ins, The Coffee Cup Net for whatever reason averages 22-29 check-ins per session – that is a lot of check-ins. The number seems to depend on the weather, and if other life or family demands have intervened.

MARC needs some new NCS Operators for our Nets. Fortunately, we have several club members who are available to help and are actively looking to train and tutor new members on how to be an NCS Operator. Also, new NCS Operators can take over a Net periodically, allowing us to share and rotate NCS honors. They include Mike KC1MJZ, Shawn KC1NQE, Ed W1YSM, Douglas KC1SFH, and Chris K1MAL. Some other Club members also are NCS operators and run Nets --- members including N1ZN Jim, John K1VDF, and Steve KC1QWH. Becoming an NCS Operator is also part of the MARCONI Program. John K1LYP is the Manager of that Program. Running a Net is fun (really) and a good NCS operator makes running the Net fun for all the check-ins as well. Bear in mind, Emergency Nets are not meant to be fun and the demeanor of the NCS for those sessions are all business and vastly different from the other Nets.

Those of you who are interested should google "NCS in amateur radio", look on YouTube, or better – contact one of the above named MARC Club members AND check-in or at least stand-by (listen in but not check-in) during the On Air Net to see what it's all about. Although all NCS Operators are expected to make announcements, take check-ins, and call on the check-ins to make comments, each Net also can have its own idiosyncrasies which you can best understand and appreciate if you check-in, or at a minimum, stand-by several times until you can summon up the courage to push the PTT button and proudly shout out your call sign.

Go ahead check-in, and dip in an electronic toe in the metaphorical ether, and throw out your call sign. You have it, why not use it. If you need a little help, I know a guy. He might well be just what you need to get started as a NCS Operator (especially in a snowstorm) – rumor has it, he is a Smiling Friendly Ham and he is available to help if asked – or even if he isn't. As John K1LYP says – it's all part of Hams helping Hams. I hope to hear you on (running?) a Net, sometime soon.

Rookie Round-Up is open to all amateur radio operators who were first licensed in 2021, 2022, 2023, and 2024. During the event “Rookies” make contact with other “Rookies” and other Amateur Radio Operators to earn QSO points. “Non-Rookie” operators may only earn points by making contacts with “Rookies” so as you see you will be in high demand.

This is a great opportunity to learn and grow in your radio operating abilities, and to just key the mic to get past any “mic fright” you may have.

Joining us at the club will allow you to operate on all the HF bands as we will have an Extra Class Licensed Control operator on site throughout the contest.

You can participate in the contest from your home but will need to stay within your FCC authorized Frequencies. Technician class “Rookie” operators have phone privileges on the 10 meter band between 28.300 and 28.500 MHz if they operate without a control operator. With a control operator present they may use all frequencies available to the control operator. General and Extra class “Rookies” may operate with their normal privileges.

There will be no judgment made if you make a mistake, we will be right alongside you to give any assistance you may need.

Mark your calendars and get ready to participate in a fun and engaging contest. We can't wait to see you in action at the Rookie Round-Up!

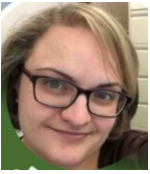

New Librarian: Mike – KC1MJZ will be the new club librarian.

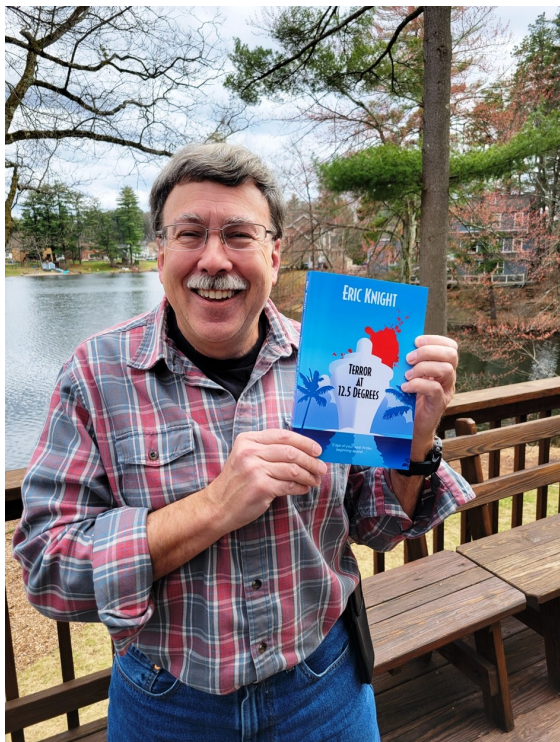
NEW BUSINESS – N1ZN would like the 3 exam manuals to be bought and donated to Wallingford Public Library.

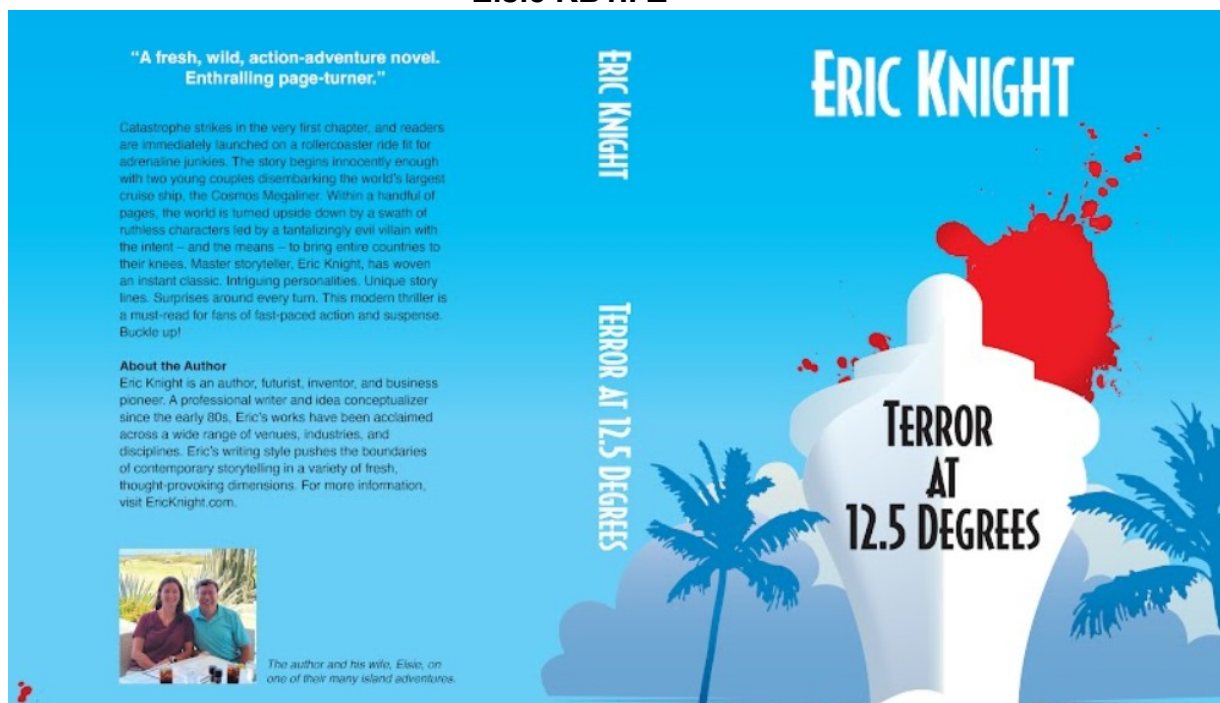

SATURDAY OEM SESSIONS ALIVE & WELL

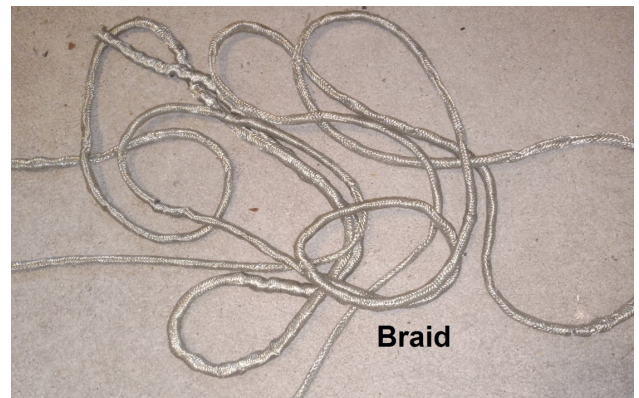
