Early on we developed a minor equipment issue that was quickly resolved by Rob K1RCT our SAM. The OEM and radio room were busy all day with Rookies and visitors engaged in the big room while awaiting their operating time slot at one of the

two stations.



The bands were shall we say less than favorable but that didn't discourage our cadre of Rookies from pursuing contacts. Each Rookie got a brief introduction the radios and how to operate on the air and then they began to make contacts. All the while there were experienced operators by their side offering guidance and encouragement.




Jim N1ZN (standing) and Bart N1BRL assist Jim KC1TSG with the first Rookie QSO of the day.



We had a full schedule but were still able to accommodate a couple Rookie walk-ins so nobody was left out. We used a 'band operating token' scheme to keep each station on a separate band. That and frequent use of the rig's auto-tuners prevented any smoke from being released in the radio room. Not all the club Rookies were at the OEM because some felt confident enough to operate from their home stations.

Each of the Rookies were encouraged to file their results on the ARRL website so they will be noted there and reported in QST. Bart N1BRL designed and provided special Rookie Roundup QSL cards for all the Rookies to complete and mail as post cards. They can enter their call sign within the lasso on the front.





Rookie Roundup wouldn't be a success without the help several club members in addition to the Rookies themselves. Among those that made this a success are Steve KC1QWH as co-coordinator and Rookie mentor, Kristin KC1ISI was great with hands on mentoring of the Rookies and photos, Rob K1RCT our SAM who just made everything work and prevented disasters, and Jim N1ZN pitched in with support for the Rookie Operators in the radio room. Our Rookies much appreciated the efforts of countless club members who found time to work from home and search for the Rookies on air. Every QSO was exciting for them to add to their log sheets.



John K1LYP expanded his mentoring of new members. He opened his station and hosted the Caron family of four new hams. They received the benefit of John's years of experience and first class station to make dozens of QSOs. John was rewarded for his initiative when he saw their enthusiasm.

The quality of the Rookie Roundup experience isn't measured solely by the number of QSO's each operator made. Several made their first ever while others with a little more experience made more but everyone was rewarded by the experience. I don't have the exact numbers at this writing but the club's Rookies will have made around 150 QSOs collectively when we tally those at the OEM with those at K1LYP's QTH and those who operated from home. QSOs included several states, some Canadian Provinces and a few DX entities spanning the Caribbean, South America and Europe. One Rookie got the prize from the Cracker Jacks. (do they still have prizes in the box?) Not only did Mike KC1TST make his first ever HF QSO but he got a radio donated by a club member to start his shack.

Treasurer's Report (Rick KC10YN): The current Treasure's Report was read by KC10YN. A copy of the report is always available to members in good standing from treasurermarc@gmail.com. There are currently 174 members. There is one club member who has and outstanding check that needs to be cashed. Reminder that dues are now \$25 a year. There is no longer a regular or senior rate. There is a \$2 fee charged for using PayPal. Many donations were made in February by: WA1EXA, N1NGV, N1WCL. The insurance policy for the current repeated was renewed for \$75 for 1 year starting April 1st. The invoice for the new repeater Yeasu Fusion came in at \$900 reimbursable to K1RCT. Once the descriptions, model numbers and serial numbers are obtained for all the equipment associated with the new repeater then the insurance will be purchased. KC10YN, WB1GFI and NA1L are working on the liability insurance; our policy expires on May 15th. Our current carrier has stopped issuing liability insurance policies.

Special Guest: AB1OC Fred Kemmerer – ARRL did receive over \$2 million from the ARDC to extended scholar-ships and club grants. More than ½ the of the last proceeds were granted to stem learning and youth outreach. Fred stressed the point that ham radio has an ageing problem. The current average age of a licensed ham radio operator is 76. Only 2 out of 10 newly licensed technicians remain after a year. ARRL has free member-ships for operators under 21 years old, is actively pursuing bringing ham radio into schools and adding a youth coding competition initiative. The life membership into the ARRL is back. ARRL is working on clearer communications from leadership to members, getting financials more streamlined, rollcall voting, getting the governing documents like the director's workbook public. Our membership did let Fred know about our struggles with getting involved with younger generations. ARISS Contact Proposals were floated as a way to get into schools. Big E discussion was had.

VE Sessions (Jim N1ZN): are held on the 2nd Saturday of the month.

Tech/Gen Classes: General class is Monday evenings via zoom with an interest of about 22 people. Fall technician class to be coordinated with Wallingford Parks & Rec.
