PRESIDENT'S COLUMN, JUNE 2024

W1NRG: WHAT'S DOING AT MID-YEAR?

This month I thought I would review where we are with our 30 or so MARC activities. These are my impressions:

Marconi Project: Things are going well with all 9 Initiatives: POTA (Dave NZ1J and Shawn KC1NQE), Fox Hunts (Rob K1RCT), CW classes (Bob KB1GYZ), Balloon Science (Ray KC1QLS), are active and engage many Club members. The Satellite Communication Program (Rob K1RCT) is moving along as well. FCC License Classes have been a huge success thanks to (James AB1DQ) and his team of teachers. The NCS Net Control emphasis has spawned a new Just Push the Button Net on Wednesday evening,

courtesy of (Steve KC1QWH). Programs involving <u>Served Agencies</u> (Eric KB1JL) are very active. MARC is an active CERT member, and MARC just sponsored an in-person SKYWARN Training Class last week, with 31 attendees. The Cheshire Walk was a successful MARC effort, and the YMCA 5K road race is on our schedule for the Fall. The monthly <u>VE Session (Jim N1ZN)</u> is a major club activity. It has promoted MARC's image and visibility in addition to helping license/upgrade more than 50-60 hams over the past 1-2 years. This Program dramatically builds Club membership and promotes camaraderie along the way.

The <u>Club Picnic (Lark at the MARC)</u>, will be reprised coming up in the July-August time frame. <u>Winter Field Day</u> was very successful. <u>Scouting</u> events, although not very active so far this year, (we recently hosted an event for Brownies) are in the strategic plans going forward. <u>Summer Field Day</u> is in full swing and promises to attract more member activity than last year. The High School <u>STEM Scholarship Program</u> (Jim NZIN and his Committee) awarded the 2024 Prize to a Wallingford Pre-Engineering student, a few weeks ago. The <u>CQ Santa</u> event was well attended last Winter and planning is in place for this Winter, as are the WARG <u>Wallingford Holiday Stroll</u> and the <u>Taste of Wallingford Town Celebrations</u>. Our <u>Saturday Morning OEM Activities</u> are booming with increasing numbers of attendees. Activity Meetings are

well-attended. Planning for the <u>Nutmeg Hamfest</u> on October 13 at Maloney HS, is underway with a Town Hall planned for June 13 to capture ideas on how to make it more successful. The Club OnAir 2m 6m 10m nets are becoming increasing more active — the Saturday Coffee Cup Net averages 20+ check-ins per week.

Importantly, Club Membership continues to expand. Following the expected loss of some members each year, the Club numbers as of this coming Thursday will be up to 182 members. This includes four members to be added to the roster, one new and three returning. Some Club hams have criticized me for being "overly concerned about numbers". Actually, I do not view the numbers as important, *per se*.

I view Club growth simply as being indicative of Club health. Is club membership perceived as being appealing? Are its members friendly and welcoming to new hams and new members? Is its

reputation one of an amateur radio club that provides value and promotes good use of precious time for its members? Do its members merely chew the rag all day or are new horizons and vistas opened at club meetings? THESE are the questions that the growth in club <u>numbers</u> answer, for me. We should not

underestimate the importance of having multiple member activities and multiple individuals to participate in those activities; that's how clubs grow. It is NOT the numbers, *per se*.

Town Halls are being used more frequently. We held one a few months ago, and another one on the Hamfest, as mentioned, is planned for June 13 at 8pm, after the Business Meeting. We are open to input from all club members – this is the way we will function going forward. It is YOUR Club; YOU have a say in how it runs. I am honored to be your President. We have much to be thankful for including a concerned membership and a solid group of Officers. As I take a step back and look at the Club, I see more and more individuals becoming more and more involved in some MARC activity; that is a sign of growth. MARC is alive and well, thanks to you all! I wish you a healthy and a happy Summer as I look forward to the Club moving forward. Enjoy the warm weather.

NEW VENUE FOR THE NEAR-FEST

Phil Brooks, KA1PXZ, Chief of NEAR-Fest, is pleased to announce that, effective October 4th, 2024, the New England Amateur Radio Festival, known as NEAR-Fest, will be held at the Hillsborough County Agricultural Society Fairgrounds and Youth Center located at New Boston NH, approximately 15 miles west of Manchester.

The reason for the permanent change in venue is due to ongoing scheduling conflicts with other events at the Deerfield (NH) Fairgrounds, NEAR-Fest's home for the past eighteen years. The hard decision to move the popular New England hamfest was taken by a unanimous vote of NEAR-Fest's Board of Directors on May 17th, 2024.

In endorsing the decision NEAR-Fest's Benevolent Dictator Emeritus, Michael Crestohl, W1RC, aka "Mister Mike" commented: "This was inevitable. The Deerfield Fairgrounds is becoming more and more popular with exhibitors and, as a designated agricultural fairgrounds, they have to give priority to agricultural events. We had a fabulous eighteen-year run. I am confident that Phil and Kelley, along with their team, will take NEAR-Fest forward at our new location for many years to come."

Other than the location nothing else will change. It is still the same NEAR-Fest we have all known and loved since 2007!

NEAR-Fest XXXVI will be held Friday October 4th and Saturday October 5th, 2024 at the Hillsborough County Agricultural Society Fairgrounds, located at 17 Hilldale Lane, (Route 13) New Boston NH. GPS Coordinates 42.9842430, -71.6793460. See you there!
