Show Me the Money

As I write this column, the Meriden Amateur Radio Club now boasts 187 members. As is to be expected for a club of this size, and as active as we are, expenses will pop-up. With this much activity and with inflation, it is clear that we could (and are) finding ourselves with a greater need for money to support our projects. When the club only had 60 or 70 members and most of the activities were low cost, we did not require a large amount of cash-on-hand. However, now with the increase in activities (we have over 30 during the year) and more to come, the club's need for cash also has increased.

We needed to raise dues to \$25 in order to ensure that we had sufficient working capital to handle day-to-day, week-to-week, month-to-month, and recurring expenses. With the advances in technology and the convenience such advances afford our Club and its members, new equipment has been needed. Further, once the equipment is purchased, additional ancillary gear is often needed to support the initial investment. New gear for Field Day costs money. Also, when you start having activities in Wallingford Town facilities, you have to pay fees and a variety of other tithes. All this means – to stay solvent, we need more income to balance the outflow. I believe it is called Economics 101.

We have held fund raisers in the past. – I remember from time-to-time we ran 50-50 raffles. When we met at the OEM for the in-person Business Meetings Al N1API would walk around with an orange roll of raffle tickets and an encouraging tone in his voice. We have also had tag sales and club tables at some events, etc. We also raise funds through the Nutmeg Ham Fest. Lately, Rick KC1OYN our treasurer has reported receipt of monetary donations from some club members. These donations are much appreciated. While all of this has been helpful, the time has now come I believe, for a more structured approach to undraising. Accordingly, and in keeping with a time-honored tradition of my administration, I plan to form a Fund Raising Committee (woo-hoo). I will propose to the membership when we have our July 11, 2024 business meeting, that we establish a new club committee for this purpose. This committee will have several members, including Rick KC1OYN as an ex officio member. This group would be tasked to come up with creative ideas for raising funds. While some internal member support can be cultivated, we should not and cannot rely on repeated monetary gifts from Club members.

With additional funding we could consider encouraging further Club growth; continue offering varied activities to our members; expanding our current programs; and offering new activities as our members continue interacting with other clubs and the general public. We could, to a degree, better advertise our Club's activities and thus increase our membership, expand publicity focusing on the benefits of amateur radio and thereby positively impact MARC and our beloved hobby. Other clubs do raise substantial funds. I believe that it is time for MARC to establish a Fund Raising Committee to bring ideas to the membership for approval. If we are going to continue to grow in size and maintain our leadership status and influence, we need to raise some external funds. It is clear (to me) that the club needs to pay attention to fundraising, not as a crisis intervention, but as an ongoing approach to raising additional dollars to ensure that we do not need to further raise dues.

As a Club, MARC needs to be forward thinking in its actions, and needs to provide the financial where-with-all to support these efforts. I am not talking about excessive and extravagant spending – but even maintaining the gear we currently have in operating condition, needs financial support. Importantly, the membership will, of course, continue to approve all expenditures as usual. Accordingly, there is no need to even think of this money as having the potential of becoming a slush-fund. I hope the membership shares my and the other Officers' vision and will support the concept of establishing a Fund Rasing Committee. With apologies to Spidey and his Uncle Ben, (who obviously were referring to MARC), "With great growth in amateur radio, comes great expenses".

We will discuss this at the business meeting on July 11. 73.

May 9, 2024 Business Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order by the President of the club Ed Snyder, W1YSM at 19:00 EDT. Secretary's Report (Judy W1BJG): Minutes approved for April. The following applicate was voted in KC1SYU James Cosgrove.

Treasurer's Report (Rick KC10YN): The current Treasure's Report was read by KC10YN. A copy of the report is always available to members in good standing from treasurermarc@gmail.com. There are currently 174 members. There is one club member who has and outstanding check that needs to be cashed. The MARCONI account now sits idle with \$5 as all the NutFeast monies have been moved to its own account. The repeater was purchased. Reminder dues are now \$25 a year as of April 1st. There is no longer a regular or senior rate. There is a \$2 fee charged for using PayPal.

In February of 2019 a motion was made to the club by Al N1API "To waive the annual dues for licensed amateurs under the age of 18" was adopted in March 2019 meeting. We currently have 2 youth members. Motion to "Waive the annual dues for any one under the age of 18 that shows interest in amateur radio and wishes to join the club." Voted and approved.

Motion for "X amount of dollars for the funding for DreamHost contract and the contract for APlus will not be renewed." During the discussion the amounts discussed were first year introductory rate of \$2.99 a month with a \$25 set up fee total being \$60.40. This was amended to "Funding for DreamHost contract and the contract for APlus will not be renewed for an amount not to exceed \$100".

This was then amended a 3rd time to read "Allocate \$100 contract with DreamHost for internet services between now and November and at the earliest time possible drop the existing APlus services which will not be renewed and going forward allocate \$150 per year for internet services with DreamHost with a sunset date of 3 years in the future." VOTED and PASSED

KC1OYN, WB1GFI and NA1L are working on the liability insurance; our policy expires on May 15th. Our current carrier has stopped issuing liability insurance policies. Insurance policy for the current repeater was renewed for \$75 for 1 year starting April 1st.

Station Activity Manager's Report (Rob K1RCT): A full SAM Report is available to any member in good standing from r.cichon@cox.net Activity at the club included – Rookie Round Up at the Club, KC1QWH launched the Just Push the Button Net on Wednesday and had 10 check-ins.

Received the Yeasu Fusion Repeater and are testing the equipment and develop a timeline to swap the gear. K1RCT and KA1NQE brought MARCONI and MARC gear to Alaska for a POTA rove made 3 parks, 2 in Washington and 1 in Alaska. On Thurdsday April 18th the gear was stolen from the rental car. Authorities were notified and K1RCT and KA1NQE search the areas and pawn shops. Local hams also volunteered personal equipment for the rove to continue. K1RCT is filing a 'personal affects insurance claim' for the loss.

The program runs for 10 weeks starting on September 26, with classes held at the OEM at 143 Hope Hill Road starting at 6:30 pm each Tuesday night. The material comes straight from the textbook and instructors have the freedom to design their classes using whatever method works best for their style. Last year some instructors relied on presentation slides, while others brought in gear for hands-on show & tell and some used videos as part of their presentation.



The 2024 Summer 10-10 QSO Party runs from 0000 UTC August 3rd 2024 to 2359:59 August 4th 2024.

If you are a paid up 10-10 member your support of the club, and our chapter would be appreciated. Please make as many contacts as you can, and submit your log for credit. Remember to mention that you would like to credit Castle Craig Chapter of 10-10 with your score.

Log submission must be made by 8/9/24 by email to <u>tentencontest@ten-ten.org</u> you can also mail your log to the contest coordinator Dan Morris KZ3T, 3162 Covington Way, Lenoir, NC 28645.

I would appreciate it if someone would hold a local net sometime during the weekend to give local members a chance to make as many QSOs as possible.

Also, as you talk to local, (Connecticut), stations on 10 meters and also on the different bands please mention this QSO party and ask them to check 10 meters at times during the weekend to participate. Please remind them that if they are in the local ground wave area and members of 10-10, that The Castle Craig Chapter of 10-10 is their local chapter and we would appreciate their support for the QSO Parties.

If you have your collected 10-10 numbers sitting *now* is the time to send them in or go to the 10-10 web page at http://www.ten-ten.org/memship.html and either use the online shopping cart to join or fill out a paper application and mail it in. There is a special three year incentive plan for \$40.00 or you can join for the basic \$15.00 a year. 10-10 has a membership plan with electronic delivery of the 10-10 News and there are special rates for new and rejoining members of \$10.00 for one year and a three year incentive for \$25.00. There are also family rates for members available too. It takes about three weeks to get your number back via mail but if you apply online your new number will come via email in just a few days. Remember you need to be a paid up member for your log to count for awards and also toward the club and personal score listings. A good incentive for joining is that ALL 10-10 awards are FREE, and most if all do not require QSL cards and can be applied for via email. You will receive award certificates by return mail, (or), for many, you can ask for a PDF certificate to put in your computer or post on your web pages.

Even if you've decided that you are not interested in becoming a 10-10 member, you can still get on and give contacts out to those who are working the QSO Party. Your point will be welcomed. The 10 meter band is hot in the expected peak of the solar cycle and who knows what you may hear during the QSO Party.

Also, you can submit your log as a checklog if you are not a paid up 10-10 member, (though I stress this would be good time to take advantage of the 3 year incentive offer). If you still decide that 10-10 is not your cup of tea but get on and pass your information to others, you can submit a log as a check log. 10-10 was formed to keep 10 meter band active so that it is not lost to other services and that idea is still paramount in the organization's concepts.
