SOME THOUGHTS ON FIELD DAY

AS YOU KNOW, DISCUSSION OF FIELD DAY WAS TABLED AT THE JANUARY MEETING TO ALLOW SOME TIME FOR THOUGHT. I WOULD LIKE TO PUT FORTH SOME QUESTIONS WHICH SHOULD BE ADDRESSED IN ORDER TO HAVE A FIELD DAY THAT SERVES THE WANTS OF THE MAJORITY OF THE MERIDEN AMATUER RADIO CLUB MEMBERSHIP.

WITH THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS THAT WE HAVE, IT SEEMS THE MOST LOGICAL ENTRY CLASS FOR US IS 1A (SINGLE TRANSMITTER/CLUB), ALTHOUGH 2A IS MORE FUN. COULD WE GATHER ENOUGH PEOPLE FOR 2A? SHOULD WE PROCEED AS A CONTEST OR JUST FOR FUN? A CONTEST TYPE OF FIELD DAY WOULD PROBABLY MEAN MOSTLY CW OPERATION.

IT'S BEEN SUGGESTED THAT WE ACTUALLY HAVE TWO FIELD DAY SETUPS; ONE FOR CONTESTING AND ONE FOR FUN. DOES THIS SOUND GOOD TO YOU? DOES THAT MEAN THE CONTEST STATION GOES QRP, BATTERY, CW FOR THE MAXIMUM POINT ADVANTAGE? WHAT ABOUT THE FUN STATION?
... SSB?... 200 WATTS? MAYBE KW? OF COURSE, THAT MEANS GENERATOR POWER. DOES THIS ALSO MEAN THE CONTEST STATION WOULD GET THE BEST EQUIPMENT AND ANTENNAS AND THE OTHER STATION THE LEFTOVERS? WHAT ABOUT INTERFERENCE BETWEEN THE TWO STATIONS?
... WOULD THE FUN STATION BE WILLING TO YIELD TO THE CONTEST STATION?

THE WALLINGFORD AMATUER RADIO SOCIETY HAS SUGGESTED THAT PERHAPS WE JOIN FORCES WITH THEM FOR FIELD DAY, SINCE THEY HAVE HAD A DUAL F.D. (CONTEST AND FUN), BUT NOT ENOUGH BODIES TO MAKE EITHER EFFECTIVE. IF WE JOINED THEM FOR A COMBINED F.D. EFFORT, WHAT GROUP NAMES WOULD WE ENTER UNDER? WOULD THIS BE THE FIRST YEAR THAT THE MARC NAME DID NOT APPEAR IN THE HIGH F.D. STANDINGS BECAUSE WE CHANGED OUR NAME? OR PERHAPS, THE CONTEST STATION COULD ENTER UNDER THE MARC NAME, WHILE THE FUN STATION COULD USE THE WARS NAME?

PLEASE REVIEW THESE QUESTIONS AND DECIDE WHAT TYPE OF FIELD DAY OPERATION YOU WOULD LIKE AND MAKE YOUR FEELINGS KNOWN ALONG WITH ANY OTHER QUESTIONS YOU MAY HAVE AT THE NEXT MEETING.

73'S BILL WIKKF HISTORICAL MOMENTS OF THE M.A.R.C.

THE OLD AND ORIGINAL MERIDEN AMATUER RADIO CLUB WAS ORGANIZED SOME TIME AFTER WORLD WAR I BY MEMBERS OF THE OLD CONN. TELEPHONE AND ELECTRIC CO.. MEETINGS OF THE GROUP WERE HELD AT THE COMPANY FACILITIES ON BRITANIA STREET WHERE MANY WIRE ANTENNAS DECKED THE ROOFTOP. EXPERIMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS WITH RECEIVERS AND TRANSMITTERS CONSTRUCTED BY THE CLUB MEMBERS LAID THE GROUNDWORK FOR AMATUER RADIO IN MERIDEN.

TODAY'S NEW MERIDEN AMATUER RADIO CLUB SPRANG UP IN THE FALL OF 1947 FOLLOWING A NEED OF THE AMATUER COMMUNITY FOR ORGANIZATION FOLLOWING THE SHUTDOWN OF HAM RADIO DURING THE WORLD WAR II YEARS.

IN RESPONSE TO A NEWSPAPER ARTICLE CALLING AREA RADIO AMATUERS TO A MEETING AT THE MERIDEN YMCA A SERIES OF INFORMAL MEETINGS WITH ABOUT TEN FORMED THE NUCLEUS OF THE PRESENT M.A.R.C.. SUBSEQUENT MEETINGS CULMINATED TO A FORMAL SLATE OF OFFICERS AND A CLUB NAME.

A SERIES OF ARTICLES TAKEN FROM EARLY MINUTES OF THE M.A.R.C. WILL BE PUBLISHED TO INFORM US OF HAPPENINGS DURING THE EARLY DAYS OF THE "FIRST 37 YEARS".

FEB 29, 1948.

AN ELECTION OF OFFICERS (OF THE MERIDEN AMATUER RADIO CLUB) WAS HELD WITH THE FOLLOWING BEING ELECTED:

PRES. FRANK DARMOFALSKI - W1FYG V.PRES. HOWARD WESSENBERG - W1HVF SEC. HERB ELLMERS - W1QPD TRES. ED BISHERT - W1NRG

ENTERTAINMENT - LARRY COOK, HOWARD WESSENBERG, ED MIERZ, LOUIS JACOBS.

EMERGENCY COORDINATOR - PAUL RETTENMEYER

CLUB DUES ARE TO BE PAID ON A MONTHLY BASIS IN ADVANCE AND ARE TO BE PAID IN BEFORE MEETING.

A PRIZE IS TO BE AWARDED TO THE MEMBER BRINGING IN THE MOST NEW MEMBERS WITHIN THE COMING TWO MONTHS. THE PRIZE IS TO BE " THE RADIO HANDBOOK".

JAMES WHITE WIPHW IS TO BE CODE INSTRUCTOR IN CODE CLASSES. 15 MEMBERS ATTENDING.

THE MEETING CLOSED AT 10 P.M. H. ELLMERS SEC.

NOTES: (W1FD) - DUES WERE 25 CENTS/MTH. THE ABOVE MEETING WAS FORMAL MEETING #4. 51% OF THE MEMBERS HAD TO BE LICENSED. SWL WERE ASSOC. MEMBERS (NO VOTING PRIVILEGES AND COULD NOT HOLD OFFICE).

PACKET RADIO DEMONSTRATION

AT OUR ACTIVITY MEETING ON FEBRUARY 28TH, WE WERE TREATED TO A DEMONSTRATION OF PACKET RADIO BY JIM AHERNS WA1IXU FROM WOLCOTT. JIM HAS BEEN ACTIVE WITH PACKET SINCE ABOUT NOVEMBER 1984, AND IN THAT TIME HAS SEEN THE NUMBER OF STATIONS IN OUR AREA INCREASE FROM ROUGHLY 30 TO OVER 50.

IN HIS PRESENTATION JIM FIRST EXPLAINED WHAT PACKET RADIO IS AND HOW IT WORKS. AFTER THE LECTURE JIM GAVE US A PRACTICAL DEMONSTRATION OF IT'S CAPABILITIES, AT TIMES USING UP TO FOUR OTHER STATIONS AS RELAY POINTS.

PACKET DIFFERS FROM RTTY IN THE WAY IT TRANSMITTS/RECEIVES DATA. IT ORGANIZES THE DATA INTO BLOCKS (PACKETS). THIS PACKET IS THEN SENT TO ANOTHER STATION. FULL ERROR CHECKING IS DONE TO ENSURE THAT NO DATA IS LOST DUE TO FADING, WHICH IS A CONCERN WHEN USING RTTY. IF AN ERROR IS DETECTED BY THE RECEIVING STATION, IT WILL REQUEST THE SENDING STATION TO RETRANSMITT THE BLOCK UNTIL IT IS RECEIVED 100%. THE DATA ITSELF IS TRANSMITTED IN ASCII, SO THOSE OF YOU THAT CAN RECEIVE ASCII CAN LISTEN IN ON PACKET TRANSMISSIONS.

THE BIGGEST DIFFERENCE BETWEEN PACKET AND RTTY THOUGH, IS THE ABILITY TO USE "ANY" OTHER PACKET STATION THAT IS ON THE AIR. AS A REPEATER. FOR EXAMPLE: STATION A WANTS TO TALK TO STATION B BUT THE TWO ARE SEPARATED BY A LARGE HILL, AND THEIR SIGNALS ARE TWO WEAK TO MAKE CONTACT. AS LONG AS THERE IS A STATION THAT BOTH CAN REACH, LETS SAY STATION C, THEN STATION A CAN SAY "CONNECT TO STATION B VIA STATION C". STATION C IS NOW A REPEATER FOR THE TWO STATIONS (A + B).

I THOUGHT THAT THE DEMONSTRATION WAS VERY INTERESTING AND HOPE THOSE OF YOU THAT ATTENDED ENJOYED IT ALSO. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK JIM ONCE AGAIN FOR TAKING THE TIME TO GIVE US THIS LOOK AT PACKET RADIO.
